² Above Him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet and with two they were flying. ³ And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty; the whole earth is full of His glory." ⁴ At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke. ⁵ "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips and my eyes have seen the King, the Lord Almighty" (Isaiah 6:2-5, New International Version).

Date: 739 B.C to 681 B.C.

Context: Isaiah 6 is God's commission to Isaiah to be a prophet for the LORD primarily to the southern kingdom of Judah. Isaiah experienced God's glory to humble and encourage him to go forth in God's Name to warn God's people to repent, to proclaim God's future deliverance and to foreshadow the coming of God's Messiah perhaps more than any other Old Testament prophet.
